The opening will be a press conference with SoHo/NoHo against the City's upzoning which will benefit landlords and developers like the Chu family who closed Jing Fong, and in support of our respective community-led rezoning plans. We're going to talk with TenantsPAC to see if they would like to work on the press conference together. The closing event will be a Town Hall where we sum up our next steps.

Candidate Walks:

We met with Lindsey Boylan, Ben Kallos, Brad Hoylman, Dianne Morales, and will be walking with Mark Levine and Art Chang. Rob reached out to Maya Wiley's campaign. The reception has been good, we have a solid itinerary of sites and backstory to support the need for the CWG. Boylan, Hoylman and Kallos have all taken a public stand in support of the plan. Do we want to endorse any candidates? It could bring good publicity to the CWG and help guide voters. We'll follow up with the candidates to ask them to put community-led rezoning in their platform and see who follows through. We might want to endorse two candidates if both follow through with our asks.

Marte Campaign

There are two months until the election and if people have capacity to volunteer, mostly voter contact but also need for admin/graphics. There will also be a Chinese for Marte committee that focuses on small business displacement and de Blasio's jail.
